EEFS2011 European Economics and Finance Society Call for papers The tenth Annual EEFS Conference, will be held in London, UK on 9th-12th June 2011 hosted by the Queen Mary University of London The EEFS has a broad focus covering all areas in economics and finance. Every year, however, we specify a conference theme that reflects the focus of the keynotes speeches, the panel contributions, and the journal special issues of the conference. This year's theme is: "The Global Economy, European Macroeconomic Policies and International Finance: Challenges and Prospects" Papers are solicited in all areas of economics and finance, including: - Macroeconomic Theory and Policy - Financial Markets and Institutions - International Monetary Economics - International Finance - Growth and Development - European/World Integration - International Trade and General Equilibrium - Banking - Economics of Transition - Spatial/Regional Economics - Industrial Economics and Organisation - Political Economy - Public Economics - Labour Economics After the conference, participants will have the opportunity to submit their papers to several established journals that will publish peer-reviewed special issues of EEFS conference submissions. Keynote Speakers: Professor Joshua Aizenman (University of California, Santa Cruz and President of the International Economics and Finance Society-IEFS) and Professor Kenneth N. Kuttner (Robert F. White Class of 1952 Professor of Economics, Williams College) Paper Submission Abstracts of papers and/or session proposals should be submitted electronically by April 4th, 2011 to the scientific committee of the conference as attachments (.doc or .pdf format) at the following email address: eefs@eap.gr Abstracts of no more than 200 words should contain JEL classification codes. The authors' full name, affiliation, address, phone/fax, and e-mail for correspondence should also be indicated. An entire paper may be submitted, when available, but it must include an abstract. All abstract submissions and paper submissions should be accompanied by a properly filled-in excel file (see attached file "authors form.xls"), which should be submitted after having been renamed according to the corresponding author's last name (e.g. "Brown.xls"). Changes of contact details, author names, etc., should be submitted via this excel form as well. No submissions will be valid if they are not accompanied by the excel form. Proposals for complete sessions are also encouraged. Each session should be made up of three papers. In the submitted proposals, session organizers should also submit one excel file (see above) for each paper of the session. We welcome theoretical, empirical and policy-oriented papers. Participants are expected to serve as programme chairs at the Conference sessions. Paper acceptances will be sent by 15th of April 2011. The deadline for the payment of the conference fee will be May 2nd 2011. Authors whose papers are selected for the conference should send an electronic copy of the final version of their papers (along with the excel form) by May 16th 2011 in order to upload their papers on the conference website in a timely manner. Papers should not exceed a maximum of 20 pages. Please check the conference website regularly for accommodation booking and conference fee payment instructions. Conference Fee The Conference fee is €260 and should be paid by May 2nd 2011. It covers access to all sessions, a welcome reception on the evening of 9th of June, buffet lunches and gala dinner, conference coffee breaks and conference material. Conference fees will not cover the participation in the voluntary excursion planned on 12-th June. The conference fee for research students is €160 (a covering letter of proof of research student status is required either from your supervisor or the head of your department). The fee for accompanying persons, which includes a welcome reception, lunches and gala dinner, is €100 per person. Late payments: After May 2nd the conference fee will be €350 for professionals and €210 for research students. Best Student Paper Award From 2011 the EEFS will establish an award of €800 for the best student paper presented at the annual EEFS conference. All of a paper's authors must be

students for the paper to be considered for this award.
