The next meeting of the Southwestern Economic Theory (SWET) Conference will be February 28 - March 2, 2003 at the UCLA Conference Center at Lake Arrowhead, CA. The Conference will begin with a dinner and reception on Friday February 28, and conclude in the early afternoon on Sunday March 2. > As always, we are interested in presentations of work in all areas of economic theory (very broadly interpreted), both by faculty and by graduate students. We are especially interested in presentations by faculty new to the SWET consortium. Submissions for possible presentation should be sent to me as electronic submissions (pdf files). Submissions will be accepted November 1 - December 13, 2002. The UCLA Conference Center at Lake Arrowhead is located in a beautiful mountain area a 2 hour drive from Los Angeles. Information about the Center can be found at their website: <http://www.uclaconferencecenter.com/> Several unusual features of the Center are important to keep in mind: 1) The Conference Center provides lodging AND meals for all participants. 2) The Conference Center REQUIRES a 2-day stay. You must check in on Friday and check out on Sunday it will NOT be possible to check in or out on Saturday. 3) Most of the accommodations are nominally doubles ... but "doubles" means two essentially separate bedrooms and two separate bath rooms, sharing a living room.
