The Interdisciplinary Center for Economic Science (ICES) at George Mason University is currently accepting applications for our Ninth Visiting Graduate Student Workshop in Experimental Economics at from July 30 - August 6, 2003. The purpose of the workshop is to provide an introduction to laboratory methods in economics for graduate students. This program also consists of a pre- and post-doctoral visitor program whose candidates can be drawn from the participants in the workshops. We have had several Visiting Pre-Doctoral and Post Doctoral Fellows recruited from these summer workshops. The workshop will open with a reception the evening of Wednesday, July 30 and will consist of 11 half-day sessions, from Thursday, July 31 through Wednesday, August 6, 2003. Sunday, August 3 will be a free day. In each regular session the students will participate in an experiment for cash which will be followed by a presentation and discussion of the research area. There will be a session devoted to the uses of experimental economics teaching and another geared toward a discussion of research proposals by current participants. There will be a modest stipend of \$300 for each participant. In addition, each participant will be paid his or her cash earnings from the experiments. Thus, as part of their learning experience, participants must earn all additional money needed to help recover their travel and living expenses.
