The purpose of General Equilibrium Theory Workshop in Asia (GETA) is to provide a venue for researchers working on general equilibrium theory and its related fields to present their current work on a regular basis. The workshop is primarily aimed at researchers based in Asia, but researchers from other parts of the world are of course welcome to participate. Papers presented in GETA can be submitted for publication in the annual special issue of the Journal of Mathematical Economics, which also includes papers presented at the European Workshop on General Equilibrium Theory and @the NBER General Equilibrium Conference in the United Sates. The program committees of these three workshops will also provide guest editors for the special issue. As the name suggests, the main topic of the workshop is the general equilibrium theory and its direct applications to economic problems, such as finance theory and dynamic macroeconomics theory. However, this should not be taken as a restriction: GETA is also interested in other related fields with potential implications on the general equilibrium theory, such as game theory and decision theory. The ultimate goal of GETA is to be one of the focal points for researchers in economic theory in Asia.
